- \$296,095.12 (57%) remains in losses for applicants

CARES 2.0

- March 29, 2021:
 - ➤ NOAA Fisheries announced allocation of \$255 million in fisheries assistance funding.
 - ➤ The funding supports activities previously authorized under CARES 1.0.
 - Allocated to states and territories with coastal and marine fishery participants who have been negatively affected by COVID-19.
- June 28, 2021- 1st NH Commercial Saltwater Sector Work Group Meeting

CARES ACT 2.0 CRITERIA

- Same qualifying criteria as CARES 1.0
- NH resident (person, LLC, company, etc.) only.
- >35% Economic Loss compared to 2015-2019 average.
- No minors
- Only Fisheries Related:
 - Qualifying: Commercial Fishing, For-Hire, Aquaculture, Seafood Processors/Dealers, and "Other" Related Fishery Businesses.
 - Non-Qualifying: Further down the supply chain; such as vessel repair, restaurants, or seafood retailers.

CARES ACT 2.0 CRITERIA (continued)

- Cannot compensate, state, local, or tribe for lost municipal or government tax revenue
- Only address fishery-related direct or indirect losses
- Cannot apply to other federal programs for assistance to address the same impacts resulting from COVID-19.
- Cannot be compensated from all federal programs combined for assistance to address COVID-19 for more than related losses. "Cannot be made more than whole of loss".
